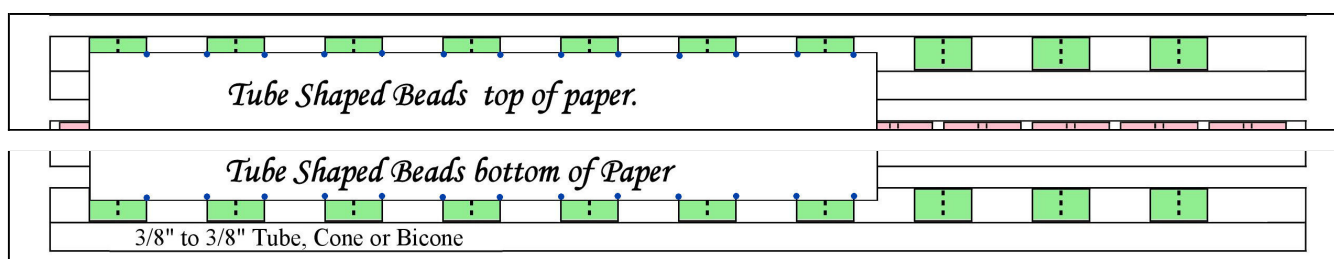
Marking Template Use Instructions

These instructions are designed solely to guide you in using the marking rulers for creating paper bead strips in basic shapes. They do not cover the process of crafting the different bead shapes themselves. The dashed lines on the rulers are intended purely as alignment guides for positioning your paper and should not be used for marking. The bead names are based on specific measurements: a "Bicone" bead has a narrow end that is less than half the width of its wide end, while a "Barrel" bead has a narrow end that is more than half the width of its wide end.

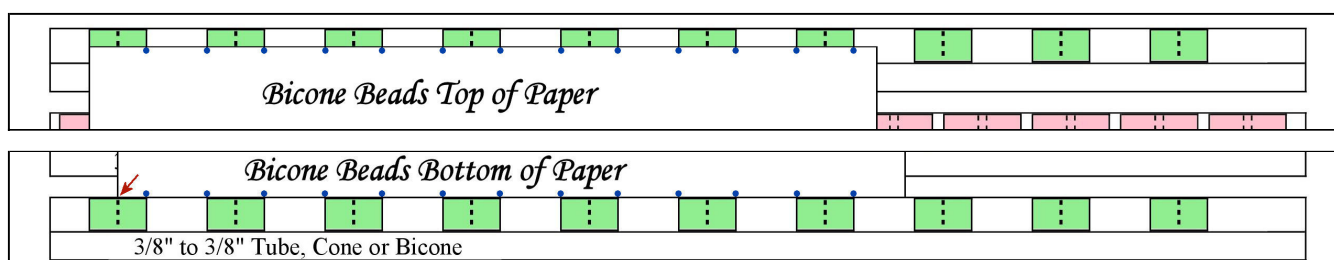


Bicone, Cylinder and Barrel Beads:

- Top Edge of Paper** Lay the marking template on your work surface. Lay the paper, back side up, to be marked, on the marking template, of your choice so the top edge of the paper is on the ruler you want to use. With a pencil, mark each strip, using every solid vertical line, across your paper, moving your paper over when you need to, to add more lines.
- Bottom Edge of Paper** Place the bottom edge of the paper, starting at the left edge, lined up with the 2nd dashed vertical line of the same ruler. Using the dashed vertical lines will help you in centering the narrow end of the strip, at the bottom of your paper, to the wide end of the strip, at the top. With your pencil, and using only the solid lines, mark your paper across on each vertical solid line.
- Drawing Lines** When you are done with marking the top and bottom edge of your paper, connect the marks with a straight edge and a pencil. Draw your lines from the top to bottom connecting the dots you marked across your paper.



Tube Shaped Beads: Also known as Cylinder Beads. To make tube shaped beads, just mark your paper using the rulers that have the same sizes all the way across, so your strips are the same width at both ends.



Bicone Beads: To make a bicone bead from the rulers that say tube, or bicone bead, just lay your paper half way on the first section to begin your marks. On the other end of the paper, start at the edge of the ruler on the edge of the paper. Make sure the narrow end is centered to the wide end of your strips using the centered dashed lines as your guide.

Cone Shaped Beads: Mark your paper as you would for tube beads but then add a diagonal line going from the left upper corner, down to the bottom right corner of each straight strip to form 2 right triangle per strip.
